#### Guidelines Regarding Head Lice Mrs. Beebe

Parents: This time of year head lice occurs more often. Common signs and symptoms to watch for include: intense itching of the scalp, adult lice (that can be very tiny at first) which may be found behind the ears and along the back of the neck, and lice eggs (nits) which can be mistaken as dandruff but don't brush off. Getting lice isn't a sign of bad hygiene or an unclean living environment. It most commonly spreads through close personal contact and by sharing personal belongings. There are many over the counter products for treatment and if symptoms persist you can contact your doctor. The Iowa Department of Public Health recommends a 14 day treatment regime. Guidelines for students with head lice:

- Students can be screened on an individual basis, but the Des Moines Public Schools no longer does routine mass screenings for head lice
- Parents are encouraged to regularly screen their children for lice. It should be assumed that head lice are in the community and schools at all times. Spend 15 minutes each week on each child carefully looking for head lice or nits. Persons with nits within <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch of the scalp OR live lice should be treated. Careful use of a nit comb can potentially remove all lice. Each child should have his or her own comb or brush. Teach your child NOT to share hats, scarves, brushes, combs, and hair fasteners.
- Any child found to have head lice can finish the school day and be treated that evening at home
- Child's parent will be notified

# HUBBELL HIGHLIGHTS

- Child must be treated in order to return to school the next day
- "No-nits" policies that require a child to be free of nits before they can return to school are not recommended. Children should not be excluded from school. Head lice can be a nuisance but have not been shown to spread disease.

#### CREATIONS FROM THE ART ROOM Lynn Ethington

Hubbell will be represented at the annual Des Moines Public Schools Art Exhibit by 5th graders Precious Daley and Summer Williams and 4<sup>th</sup> graders James McMahon and Connelly Corcoran. The exhibit will be held February 7-14 in the foyer of Capital Square.

Kindergarten will be learning about creativity, a perfect fit for the art classroom. To connect with their "How We Express Ourselves Unit" they will mix colors and paint hearts in the style of artist Peter Max. We will discuss how we use our "art eyes" and do watercolor paintings of eyes. Using a paper palette they will make a collage for their IB portfolio showing their creative spirit.

1st graders will learn about the artist Alexander Calder, the inventor of the mobile. They will create a stand mobile using pipe cleaners, wire, button, beads, and Model Magic shapes.

The Des Moines Art Center has two great mobiles by Alexander Calder in the foyer. Students should enjoy watching a mobile move and create shadows. This connects with their "How The World Works Unit".

Second graders are finishing up their Personality Drawings that tied into their last unit of Who We Are. They have created symbols and lines to represent themselves and are using oil pastels for color. We are learning how to use the color wheel to help us blend colors.

Third graders are creating multimedia projects based on the artist Henri Matisse. They are using watercolor pencils, cut paper, and printing for these colorful works of art. The Des Moines Art Center has a wonderful painting by Matisse titled "Woman in White".

Fourth graders just finished drawings of Doodle Insects that included very creative patterns and designs. Pop Art clay pizzas will be our next assignment. If you are interested in helping during the clay unit please let me know at <u>lynn.ethington@dmschools.org</u>.

Fifth graders are going to learn about the artist Peter Max and his iconic posters. He used color, repeated shapes and patterns in his artwork. To tie into their "Who We Are" the students will pick a cause that they feel passionate about and create a poster to support that cause. They will learn about poster design and different lettering styles. These techniques will be helpful to them during their exhibition unit.

Get ready for Hubbell's annual Jump Rope for Heart event on February 15, 2013. All 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders are invited to participate with parental permission. Proceeds from the event will go to the American Heart Association. A large portion of our donation will remain in Iowa for heart disease research. Last year Hubbell jumpers raised about \$3000. This year will mark Hubbell's 31<sup>th</sup> year of participation. During these years, Hubbell students have contributed more than \$100,000. ## IB Update

In the last Hubbell Highlights (http://hubbell.dmschools.org/parents/hubbell-highlights/), some interesting facts about Hubbell and the International Baccalaureate Organization were shared. One of these facts was that Hubbell was the first elementary school in the state of Iowa authorized to implement the IB Primary Years Program (PYP). This might lead an inquiring mind to wonder just how this came to be! It is with a strong sense of pride that I write about Hubbell's journey to authorization and beyond—its success a direct result of the dedication and hard-work of the Hubbell community.

#### Hubbell's Journey Toward Authorization

#### **\*** 2007-2008:

- Teachers and parents visited IB schools in Minnesota. Both groups were quite impressed and came back excited to begin our IB journey.
- Hubbell teachers were sent to IB professional development.
- **\*** 2008-2009:
  - Schedules were created that allowed common planning time with teachers. This time was spent reorganizing district standards and objectives into conceptual units within the IB's framework. From this work, each grade level wrote 6 units of inquiry.
  - The rest of Hubbell staff was sent to IB professional development.
  - Spanish classes were added to the schedule for all of our students.
  - Our amazing IB parent board was established—they worked tirelessly presenting to the school board and community members in order to gain support for the IB program. On April 8, 2008, the school board approved the first IB budget for Hubbell.
- **\*** 2009-2010:
  - Teachers worked hard to write, teach, and reflect upon all 6 units of inquiry, meaning this was the first year Hubbell curriculum fit into the IB framework in its entirety.
  - Application for authorization (a lot of documentation that demonstrated our commitment and ability to provide an IB education to students) was submitted and APPROVED! Hubbell became the first elementary school in Iowa authorized to provide an IB PYP education!
- **♦** 2010-today:
  - IB parent board and PTA have continued to demonstrate their support of teachers and the IB program through events, such as open house and cultural fair, and through their generous support of providing money for supplies, field trips, and speakers that support the units of inquiry.
  - Teachers have continued to show a deep level of commitment through their hard work in teaching and continually reflecting on units of inquiry, teaching styles, and assessments. In addition, teachers have worked to ensure they are meeting the requirements of the common core through the framework of IB.
- ✤ Our next steps:
  - Currently, Hubbell is going through IB Evaluation. Hubbell staff has reflected and analyzed our implementation of the IB program and made a plan for how to continue offering the IB program at a deep and meaningful level for all of our students.
  - On March 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> we will have the opportunity to gain feedback from IB educators when they come to Hubbell for a site visit. We are looking forward to their feedback and our continued IB journey!
