### Guidelines Regarding Head Lice Mrs. Beebe

Parents: This time of year head lice occurs more often. Common signs and symptoms to watch for include: intense itching of the scalp, adult lice (that can be very tiny at first) which may be found behind the ears and along the back of the neck, and lice eggs (nits) which can be mistaken as dandruff but don't brush off. Getting lice isn't a sign of bad hygiene or an unclean living environment. It most commonly spreads through close personal contact and by sharing personal belongings. There are many over the counter products for treatment and if symptoms persist you can contact your doctor. The Iowa Department of Public Health recommends a 14 day treatment regime. www.idph.state.ia.us/hcci/common/pdf/headlice\_br ochure.pdf Guidelines for students with head lice:

- Students can be screened on an individual basis, but the Des Moines Public Schools no longer does routine mass screenings for head lice
- Parents are encouraged to regularly screen their children for lice. It should be assumed that head lice are in the community and schools at all times. Spend 15 minutes each week on each child carefully looking for head lice or nits. Persons with nits within ¼ inch of the scalp OR live lice should be treated. Careful use of a nit comb can potentially remove all lice. Each child should have his or her own comb or brush. Teach your child NOT to share hats, scarves, brushes, combs, and hair fasteners.
- Any child found to have head lice can finish the school day and be treated that evening at home
- Child's parent will be notified
- Child must be treated in order to return to school the next day
- "No-nits" policies that require a child to be free of nits before they can return to school are not recommended. Children should not be excluded from school. Head lice can be a nuisance but have not been shown to spread disease.

### CREATIONS FROM THE ART ROOM Emily Bash

Hubbell will be represented at the annual Des Moines Public Schools Art Exhibit by: 2nd grader Tessa Bintner, 3<sup>rd</sup> grader Reese Copeland, 4<sup>th</sup> graders Averie Moeder, Megan Heilskov, Jefferson Huynh, Georgia Billingsley, Thomas Whitman, Katy Grimes, and 5<sup>th</sup> graders Chloe Neff, Nellie Parsons and Norah Egge. The exhibit will be held February 19-25 in the foyer of Capital Square.

**Kindergarten** will be learning about creativity, a perfect fit for the art classroom. To connect with their "How We Express Ourselves Unit" they will learn to use their artist eyes as we view famous artwork and create an artist palette showing how they are creative.

First graders are working on drawings of Vincent Van Gogh's Starry Night. They look amazing. Starting soon they will learn about Cave Art. They will study how the caveman used symbols in their paintings. Students will create their own piece of Cave Art using symbols, texture, and hand prints. Second graders are finishing up clay coil pots. They learned how to attach two pieces of clay by scoring and using slip in between. We can't wait to see them as they come out of the kiln from the glaze firing. Third graders just finished clay bird baths which are on display in the hall outside the artroom. They are beginning work on a graphic illustration of a noun using the spelling of the word they are drawing.

Fourth graders just finished working with clay to create a pinch pot creature. They are on display outside the artroom. They are now working on a parody of Grant Wood's American Gothic. Fifth graders are working on a clay relief sculpture inspired by the cubist portraits by Pablo Picasso. They will begin the glazing process next week and will be on display outside of the artroom once they are complete.
