Mark your calendar for the annual Maguire Relays that will be held on Thursday, May 21st. In case of rain, it will be held the following day on the 22nd. The Maguire Relays are a longtime Hubbell tradition where our students participate in games, fun activities, and races on the playground and field. Kindergarten through $2^{\rm nd}$ grade will be held in the morning, with $3^{\rm rd}$ - $5^{\rm th}$ grades participating in the afternoon. All are welcome to attend. CREATIONS FROM THE ART ROOM Emily Bash

Kindergarten has been learning about what makes them creative and how to exercise their imaginations. Please encourage them to be creative during play and to be imaginative. One great way is to look at the clouds and use their "Artist Eyes" to see things in the shapes.

First graders are beginning a collage project. They watched a video of Artist and Author Eric Carle creating his painted tissue collages. They will be painting their own colored paper to use in making an animal collage like those in Eric Carle's books. Second graders just finished creating abstract paintings in the style of artist Wassily Kandinsky. They are beginning work on a scratchboard egg after exploring the Ukrainian art form of Pysanky - the wax resist decoration of Easter eggs. Third graders just finished radial symmetry, fractions at work in the art room. Their designs are really stunning. They have just started learning about Illuminated letters and manuscripts and will be finishing their own letter after break. Fourth graders are beginning work on a monochromatic painting. Monochromatic means using tints and shades of only one color. They are

very excited to work with paint and learn to mix the right colors.

Fifth graders are just finishing up work on posters that promote a cause that is important to them. They learned about Artist Peter Max and are emulating his style in their own work. Many students chose to work with the same topics that they are researching for exhibition.

NOTES FROM THE MUSIC ROOM Mrs. Hunt

Kindergarten and 1st grade performed their spring music programs on Tuesday, March 3rd in the Hubbell Gym. The kindergarteners sang songs about farm life and farm animals and performed a sound story with percussion instruments. 1st grade sang songs about all creatures and animals, big and small. Each class demonstrated a song/game that they perform in class.

On April 3rd, the Des Moines' Opera Iowa performance group will perform an operatic version of "Billy Goats Gruff" for the 2nd grade. 2nd graders will also be in workshops with the performers in the afternoon. "Billy Goats Gruff" will be performed at 2:00pm in the Hubbell gym.

- 3. The PTA shall appoint volunteers to the Hall of Fame Committee and forward the names of each year's candidates to the Hall of Fame Committee during the first week of each school year.
- 4. The Hall of Fame Committee shall meet to select by majority vote the candidate or candidates to the Hall of Fame as soon as practicable.
- 5. The Hall of Fame Committee shall strive to select one male and one female candidate each year.

IB Update

Hubbell mission statement: "Hubbell Elementary School empowers lifelong learners to meet the challenges of tomorrow's global world."

How will we achieve this? Hubbell teachers identify an approach to learning for each of the units of inquiry taught. IB defines these 5 approaches to learning; however, our teachers individualize these approaches for specific grade levels. Each approach is used during at least one unit of inquiry at each grade level. Below are the approaches to learning and their definitions:

<u>Communication Skills</u>: When teachers are using these skill as their approach to the unit, teachers are focusing on developing students' abilities to communicate thoughts and ideas. This focus includes listening, speaking, reading, writing, viewing, presenting, and non-verbal communication. Activities in the classroom that tie to the communication skills approach include presenting projects, working in groups, listening and reflecting on presentations, and writing essays and stories.

<u>Research Skills</u>: When using these skills as their approach to the unit, teachers are focusing on developing students' abilities to formulate questions, make observations, plan, collect and record data, interpret data, and presenting research findings. Activities in the classroom include classroom experiments, researching topics/people, create power point presentations, and presenting research.

<u>Self-Management Skills</u>: When teachers are using this approach, teachers are focusing on developing students' gross and fine motor skills, organization habits, time management abilities, and student's ability to make informed and healthy lifestyle choices. Activities in the classroom that tie to this approach include working on long-term projects, gaining a deeper understanding of healthy life style choices, and activities that get kids up and moving.

<u>Social Skills</u>: When teachers are using these skills as their approach to the unit, teachers are focusing on developing students' abilities to accept responsibility for their actions, to cooperate with others, resolve conflicts with peer, make group decisions, and collaborate with others. Activities that tie to this approach include working in collaborative groups, discussing and role playing ways to handle and resolve conflicts, and activities that require students to make decisions (as opposed to the teacher making all decisions about the direction learning is taking).

<u>Thinking Skills</u>: When teachers are using these skills as their approach to the unit, teachers are focusing on developing students' abilities to think about their thinking – to analyze what they have learned, apply their learning, and to evaluate information. Activities that tie to this approach include analyzing research findings, written reflections, and self-evaluations.
