CREATIONS FROM THE ART ROOM Emily Bash

Kindergarten has been learning about what makes them creative and how to exercise their imaginations. Please encourage them to be creative during play and to be imaginative. One great way is to look at the clouds and use their "Artist Eyes" to see things in the shapes.

First graders are just finishing up a silhouette against the background of Starry Night by Vincent Van Gogh. Students looked at Van Gogh's work and identified texture and repetition in the application of paint. They used crayons to duplicate this texture in the sky for their own artwork.

Second graders learned about the artist Henri Rousseau. They looked at his tropical landscapes and created their own rainforest that they then painted. We are just getting started with our clay unit.

Third graders just finished their clay unit and will be starting abstract paintings in the style of the Fauves who painted with wild colors and short brushstrokes.

Fourth graders are beginning work on an Abstract painting. They are choosing a portrait, landscape or still life and altering their drawing to make it abstract. They are very excited to work with paint.

Fifth graders are learning about the artist and activist Peter Max. They are creating informative posters for a cause in the style of Peter Max.

Hubbell Hawk Choir has begun! Students in 4th and 5th grade are participating in choir on Tuesdays from 3:10-3:45. The choir season will end with a performance tour to nursing home/retirement communities on Friday, May 4th, and a pizza party and an informal concert for family on May 8.

On Tuesday, March 20th, 5th graders from the entire DMPS district attended the Des Moines Symphony concert at the Civic Center. The field trip was paid entirely by the district to ensure all students were connected to culture and given an opportunity to expand their music appreciation.

Kindergarten and 1st grade will sing in their spring music programs on Tuesday, April 17th in the Hubbell Gym. The Kindergarten program will begin at 6:00pm and the 1st Grade program will begin at 6:45pm.

IB Update

Hubbell mission statement: "We empower diverse learners through inquiry-based opportunities that promote life-long learning." How will we achieve this? Hubbell teachers identify an approach to learning for each of the units of inquiry taught. IB defines these 5 approaches to learning and delineates multiple strands for each; however, our teachers individualize these approaches for specific grade levels. Each strand of the 5 approaches to learning is used during at least one unit of inquiry at each grade level. Below are the approaches to learning and their definitions:

Communication Skills: When teachers are using these skill as their approach to the unit, teachers are focusing on developing students' abilities to communicate thoughts and ideas. This focus includes listening, speaking, reading, writing, viewing, presenting, and non-verbal communication. Activities in the classroom that tie to the communication skills approach include presenting projects, working in groups, listening and reflecting on presentations, and writing essays and stories.

Research Skills: When using these skills as their approach to the unit, teachers are focusing on developing students' abilities to formulate questions, make observations, plan, collect and record data, interpret data, and presenting research findings. Activities in the classroom include classroom experiments, researching topics/people, create power point presentations, and presenting research.

Self-Management Skills: When teachers are using this approach, teachers are focusing on developing students' gross and fine motor skills, organization habits, time management abilities, and student's ability to make informed and healthy lifestyle choices. Activities in the classroom that tie to this approach include working on long-term projects, gaining a deeper understanding of healthy life style choices, and activities that get kids up and moving.

Social Skills: When teachers are using these skills as their approach to the unit, teachers are focusing on developing students' abilities to accept responsibility for their actions, to cooperate with others, resolve conflicts with peer, make group decisions, and collaborate with others. Activities that tie to this approach include working in collaborative groups, discussing and role playing ways to handle and resolve conflicts, and activities that require students to make decisions (as opposed to the teacher making all decisions about the direction learning is taking).

Thinking Skills: When teachers are using these skills as their approach to the unit, teachers are focusing on developing students' abilities to think about their thinking - to analyze what they have learned, apply their learning, and to evaluate information. Activities that tie to this approach include analyzing research findings, written reflections, and self-evaluations.

As a part of our ever evolving IB journey, staff at Hubbell are undertaking the process of identifying concrete outcomes for each strand at each grade level. This school-wide work is an essential component of our professional development and another example of how Hubbell teachers strive to create the best learning environment possible!
